

Talked about Sign-up sheets for mentoring – open this up to anyone from Zion and Jasper.


With no further business to discuss, a motion was made by Alon Hemme and seconded by Anna Haas to adjourn the meeting. Motion carried.

The Elders started to review the compensation package for Pastor for next year.

Sunday, August 24; after worship, Trinity-Jasper is having another brunch after church.

Lloyd Hemme asked all committees to have their budget for 2026 submitted to him for the budget meeting.

Board of Trustees Report – Report by Alon Hemme

Have a contract for LP from Modern Gas (Popkes) for next year. Price is \$1.259 for 4500 gallons. Alon Hemme needs to contact them as they are asking for the payment in advance this year which would be about \$5,665.00.

The trustees will be meeting with ladies of the congregation to review the kitchen layout on Thursday, August 7 at 6:30 p.m.

There was general discussion on the Cleveringa Construction billing and other matters:

Alon Hemme has asked Derek Sandbulte(Cleveringa Construction) and requested more itemized statements, especially with hours and materials.

The second installment of \$125,000 is not broken down. They are talking to the contractor to make sure it is broken down. Alon Hemme has reached out to Huck at Tinklenberg Lumber to get a list of materials at the end of the project that were itemized and purchased there.

Alon Hemme also informed us that Derek never gave our Tax Id Exempt number to Tinklenberg Lumber and possibly other businesses. We were charged Sales Tax on the items. Huck said they will clarify this at the end of the year and make right with us. Not sure how many other businesses and items we were charged on. Alon is looking into this.

Alon Hemme asked for 4 tax exempt forms from Don Bryan to give to our construction crew.

Alon Hemme asked and was given approval to take 6 of the pews from the sanctuary to shorten.

The corner stone is finished – need to determine what to put in it.

Hoist way on hold - Waiting for block layers to finish.

Project appears to be about 3 weeks behind schedule – October 1 deadline is tentative.

Discussion on the sanctuary seating.

148 pew capacity

5 handicap spots for wheel chair, walker

Room for 30 chairs on the outside isle. In the back there is now room for 7 to 8 chairs Max capacity in narthex is 170

Meeting room in narthex will have monitor for overflow crowd and have extra seating up to a max capacity for the church of 250.

Alon Hemme said he increased the spacing of the pews in the sanctuary. It will be 36 inches now compared to 34 inches.

Discussion held on parking lot – will discuss more next month.

Garage update: Tony Roos will pour concrete last week of August first week of September.

Siding of church May not be completed or done until next year

Some of the highlights: Don Bryan fixed the budget columns on worksheet for Medical Expense Reimbursement and Workers Benefit plan. \$500 was the bill for getting the safety box open Handicap Fund: \$67,000 of the 126,658.22 is from Trust. Still waiting on the money from last year from Trust. A motion was made by Lloyd Hemme and seconded Anna Haas to approve the Treasurer's report. Motion Carried.

Did you hear what I heard? From Pastor Ed

Zion is blessed with a wonderful staff extension! What do I mean? Our Board of Family Ministry (Board of Education and Board of Youth) is where it all begins. These folks have been working hard, not as hard as Ashley- Sunday School Superintendent- in helping set up Sunday school and Bible class.

Second, it is the members-YOU- that is asking questions, making statements which reflect "ownership." Did you know that every single teacher for this coming year attended the Sunday school meeting? That is awesome! As Pastor I couldn't be more proud to serve such a servant heart church.

Third, I will attempt to answer some statements:

- 1. Adult Bible class will be held in the church basement. Refreshments will be served to enhance fellowship and let's face it, attendance. There is also a bathroom available in the basement.
- 2. Sunday school is running class time approximately 45 minutes instead of an hour. (9.15-10:00) The reason being is additional travel time, allowing parents to stay and attend Bible class. (Parents with children not in Sunday school are welcome to join me in Bible class.) The number one reason is that the specific lesson will run for two weeks which provides an additional "digging deep" into the Bible account. Note: It was exciting to hear the teachers wanting deeper study into God's Word and not simply "entertaining time."
- 3. High school age: Several ideas are being discussed. It's great to hear the desire to be in Bible study and at the same time help with Sunday school.
- 4. What about Wednesday nights? The plan is to resume when Zion's campus is available for use. In the meantime the Board of Family Ministry is looking into activities away from church. Example: Corn Maze.
- 5. Catechism: An orientation for the incoming class will be in October. The requirement of having memory work completed before attending has been adjusted to working on memory work in class. Parents and mentors may still work on memory work if so desired. In Sunday school class an emphasis will be encouraged to memorize the Books of the Bible.

Keep your questions and ideas coming! I love that there is an environment of safety to participate, share ideas, and that we are intentional in what we do in passing on the blessing to the present, and future generations.
